### How to boost students' motivation to read!

Boosting students' motivation to read is crucial for their cognitive development and overall academic success. When students are motivated, they engage more deeply with texts, which enhances their comprehension, vocabulary, and critical thinking skills. Reading stimulates the brain, improving cognitive functions like memory, focus, and problem-solving. Moreover, motivated readers are more likely to develop a lifelong habit of reading, which can have a profound impact on their academic performance and personal growth. It also fosters creativity and imagination, encouraging students to explore new ideas and perspectives. In the classroom, motivation can be the difference between a student who struggles with literacy and one who thrives. By creating a positive reading environment and providing relevant, interesting materials, teachers can inspire students to see reading not as a task, but as a rewarding and enjoyable activity that supports their intellectual development and prepares them for future success.

### 5 tips encourage students to read

Early encouragement in reading and writing instils a lifelong love for literature, crucial for cognitive and emotional development. At this stage, you can ignite curiosity and foster a growth mindset, setting your child up for future academic and personal success.

- Create a welcoming reading environment: create an inviting reading space with comfortable seating and colourful book displays. Curate a diverse selection of books reflecting various interests and cultures. Allow your child to choose their materials, fostering ownership and engagement. A welcoming environment promotes excitement around reading.
- 2. Incorporate interactive reading activities: Make reading engaging with games and hands-on activities. Use storyrelated crafts, discussions, or role-playing to bring stories to life. Implement reading circles for sharing thoughts and ideas. Incorporating technology, like audiobooks or apps, caters to different learning styles and enhances the reading experience.

- 3. Set reading goals and celebrate achievements: Help your child set achievable reading goals, like completing a specific number of books each month. Track progress visually and celebrate milestones with small rewards or recognition. This fosters a sense of accomplishment and pride in their reading journey, creating a positive association with reading and motivating them to read more.
- 4. Share your passion for reading: Model enthusiasm for reading by sharing your favourite books and authors. Incorporate read-aloud sessions to demonstrate expressive reading and discuss themes. Encourage students to share their recommendations. Your passion can inspire them to develop a love for reading and explore new literary worlds.
- 5. Encourage peer collaboration and discussions: Promote collaborative learning through book clubs or partner reading sessions. Allow your child to discuss their favourite books, fostering community and shared experiences. Create a "Book Talk" day for presenting books, enhancing comprehension and communication skills. Peer interaction motivates reading and builds confidence in discussing literature.
- 6. **Make it a ritual**: before bed, during transition times, whatever works but most importantly, have fun!
